Member information: Mrs Joan Holden who sadly passed away in December 2011 was the longest standing member of IA Manchester having joined Manchester IA as one of the founding members in 1956.

Following her initial surgery in 1954 Mrs Holden was among the few ileostomists who were known as 'QT' ileostomists. The American 'Ileostomy' Association was formed shortly before the formation of the IA as we know it today. Initially, patients were known as 'QT' patients – being members of one of two wards in a special gastro-enterostal department of Mount Sinai Hospital, New York. Each ward was listed as the 'Q' ward and the 'T' ward and were specific to the introduction, follow-up and development of hospitalized patients undergoing gastro-enterostal surgery for IBD. Patients from these wards would continue to meet following surgery and discuss and examine their similar

problems and solutions to coping with this post-surgery and it's complications.

They later went on to become the fore-runners of the UOA .. the United Ostomy Association.

Thus, it was in 1956 that the IA (UK) was formed and initially was known as the QT(Great Britain) for the first few months. Later it became the Ileostomy Association of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

Mrs Holden underwent her initial surgery in 1954 at The Manchester Victoria Memorial Jewish Hospital. , based in Elizabeth Street, Cheetham Hill, Manchester, founded in 1904, absorbed into the N.H.S. in 1948 and vacated in 1985.

Although she joined the (QT) IA in 1956 it was, of course, not based in regional Membership areas as now, but centralised in London; later members were transferred to their respective local branches.

Mrs Barbara Poisson, her daughter , remarked to me recently.." it would be nice to know if Mr Goldberg the surgeon who carried out the operation , is still alive, as he saved my mum's life. I was only a five and my brother was a baby, (I am now a pensioner !!).

The IA has been a great support to her over the years and it is only in the last few years that she has had to miss the meetings, which she really enjoyed."
